Thinking Workflow:

If you have ever been thinking that you should be tracking certain information in your business - prospects, clients, stock, tools, standard forms and letters, etc - then we'd probably say: 'There's probably a database in that ... '



You might create your own database as a spreadsheet page in Microsoft Excel and find that this is more than adequate. It is when the amount of stored information grows, interconnectivity with other details is required, processes need to be automated, or multiple reports/documents need to be printed that we would start to suggest a more formal database.

We are well aware that there can be reasonable investment to get such a system set up, but if it is well thought through, it can save you and your staff many hours of work (time and money) for many years. It also adds considerable value to your business should you ever wish to sell it - a business automated by a business system that provides a unique competitive advantage.

It is surprising what circumstances can suggest the introduction of a database: On looking to track the serial numbers for the various items around the house, our product: For Personal Belongings was developed (www.majorsoftware.com.au/htm/produc t_personalbel.htm). We have gone on to create Asset Management components along similar lines for our business systems and products.

What's your Backup Strategy?

If you don't have one, you could risk losing all your important business data.

PROTECT YOUR DATA

In disasters such as fire and floods, items such as film based photos, personal items, and artworks cannot be replaced.

Houses, offices, furniture, office supplies and computer hardware can usually be replaced but one-off personal items cannot.

With the ability to now record personal writings, photos, business information, and such like in digital format on a computer system, the potential losses we once associated with flood and fire can be mitigated or reduced.

However to take full advantage of this potential, you have a responsibility to backup your important data and store copies successfully off-site. This will also require you to commit a certain amount of time to perform these tasks.

Methods of Backing Up

(e) CD/DVD: This type of backup is relatively inexpensive (disks are quite cheap) and can provide invaluable historic

storage/backup strategy,
e.g. If you backup weekly, you would
have 52 disks - ensuring that you have a
recorded history of changes, allowing you to go
back to old versions where you may have
lost or overwritten something of value.

Each method has it's own advantages and disadvantages but you may find a combination of methods will better suit your business and also minimise any disadvantages that particular methods may present.

If you are unsure which strategy(s) would best suit your business, we could

discuss your requirements and review your current system(s) then structure a backup solution that works with your business.

Depending on your setup and circumstances, there are a number of strategies and technical approaches to backing up your data. Among these are:

- (a) Tape backup: for very large quantities of data, automatically setup to run overnight.
- (b) Web based off site backup: A number of providers exist in the marketplace that are able to backup your data across the Internet at set times of the day or night.
- (c) External Hard Drives: There are a number of external hard drive products on the market which would allow you to backup your own data at times suitable for you. These drives can be quite large in storage volume, allowing you to store a sequence of periodic backups.
- (d) USB Flashsticks: These devices have become quite handy in size, cheap to purchase and able to hold a fairly substantial amount of data. These devices are potentially great for storing the latest copy of data. Be advised that while the size of these devices make them easy to store and move offsite, the size can also make them easier to lose.

G25LBC Syndicated Business Clubs



The group25 LOCAL Business Club management team is expanding their business.

For those businesses that either cannot make it to the morning meetings, or wish to ramp their business up far more rapidly there is now a series of intensive Evening Tutorial courses being offered by group25

Purpose: To facilitate the learning and entrepreneurial know-how of every small business operator in the development, expansion and/or efficiency of their business.

Objectives: By the end of each session each participant will have initiated their research into the tutorial topic, in order to develop their Document of Strategies to complete as a home assignment.

Format: Classes shall be formed into Syndicates - Adult education format, with venue and housekeeping rules, agenda and protocols to be established at the start of each session. The G25 Syndicates and Tutorial series shall be started every 3 months on the 1st 2nd 3rd 4th Thursday night. Where statutory holidays interfere, an alternative night will be decided upon, with members' input.

Difference: G25LBC Clubs meet 1.5 hr weekly on mornings. Meetings include Business Clinic, Member Showcase, R.A.V.E. Report & Networking format. G25LBC Syndicates meet 5 hrs once monthly in the evenings. Format is Topic/Function training, Tutorial format

Reference and source material shall be drawn from Chapters of the BBBBoBW, Club Meeting Clinics and ECROTrain Tutorials on the entrepreneur's approach to achieving business success.

Curriculum consists or 10 topics to be delivered in 10 sessions at monthly intervals. Each Evening tutorial session will be of 5 hour duration. Starts at 5pm, concludes at 10 pm.

Each Tutorial Topic shall consist of 6 Lessons. The duration shall be 40 minutes each = 240 minutes.

Therefore the time for break out time, lesson over-runs is 60 minutes for the 5 hour Evening session.

Light meal, tea and coffee provided and consumed while

working on the topics of the day.

Each Tutorial Participant will be given an ECROTrain Business Survey Questionnaire before starting the course to help establish their position as a business operator and the future direction to take.

Each Tutorial Topic shall have a "Development Diary" work book to summarise the Member's ideas, thoughts, plans, goals and conclusions. Each participant will be given a list of Business documents and instruments they use to be collated as their source documents for the Business Planning Process.


