Why have this?



Carol realises that an expensive piece of equipment has gone missing. It is unclear who used the item last or which department is ultimately responsible for it.

Carol refers to the item at the next general staff meeting. Unfortunately Carol cannot locate or obtain the specific details of the item or any

supporting documentation. To make matters worse, no-one recorded the serial number and there are conflicting opinions about its physical appearance.

Carol realises that an expensive piece of equipment has gone missing. The asset register indicates that the equipment was returned to stores four months ago. (Sometimes you cannot control all of your staff, all of the time...)

Carol immediately sends an email to all staff, with a description, serial number, asset

number and a photo of the item in an attached PDF document.

While the original purchase document is buried in taxation files from some years ago, a scanned copy is accessible from within the Asset Register.

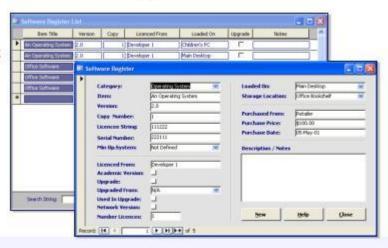
One of the staff sheepishly sends a reply email indicating that the item has been located.
